Rehearsal Times and Dates – This week's different: Welcome to the whacky last week of January. Please check the rehearsal calendar carefully.

- Tuesday and Wednesday: rehearsals are from 1:00-4:00, because those are early dismissal days.
- No school on Thursday = no practice on Thursday!
- Saturday, we'll have our first Saturday rehearsal.
- Please check the schedule that Mrs. Metcalfe sends and make sure you student comes for their rehearsal slot they do not need to be there other times. Rehearsal schedules are also posted here.

Rehearsal reminders:

- Students need to wear comfortable, moveable clothing every day no boots or Uggs.
- Saturday rehearsal is from 10-2 for all cast members. Please send a lunch with your student remember, no one is to leave school property during rehearsal.
- Students Bring your script to every rehearsal
- Parents please pick up students on time

Production Meeting/Production Start – Sets, and Costumes, and Props, Oh My! Last Sunday the creative team as well as chairs of costumes, props, set construction, set decorating, and tech crew committees met to learn more about the set design and costume/prop visions and understand how that impacts the other production areas. This weekend, several members of the set construction, costumes, and props committees met to unload the storage container and start organizing pieces for the set, unveiling costumes, and sorting props! The peach is being planted and will soon start to grow!!

Inquiring Minds May Want to Know:

• Saturday, February 9th – start bringing in bins! Kim mentioned at the parent's meeting each actor will need to bring in a bin <u>labeled with their name on all 4 sides and the top</u> for costume storage. You can find a sample bin by clicking on the link <u>here</u>. You can get these at Target, Walmart, Home Depot, etc. You may just have one lying around the house. It does not have to

be this exact brand or style. The bins will be used to store your child's costume items and shoes, but also their street clothes when they are wearing their costumes. Saturday rehearsals are a good time to bring in bins so they can go straight back to the music room.

- All girls will need a nude leotard or nude cami and dance/bike shorts, and all boys will need black compression shorts and a black or white tank top. Footwear is usually nude or black jazz shoes but we will send out further direction once we have begun fitting kids in costumes. You do not need to get these items right away just letting you know in case you have something at home to set aside or see a great sale you can't pass up!
- Hair and Make-up information will be coming out in about a month or so. For anyone like me who has no idea what to buy when you get to the make-up aisle, never fear! Gina Dicks, our chair of hair and make-up will supply us with a list with specifics with color, suggested brand names (not expensive), etc.
