They will be sent home with your cast member closer to tech week.

From the Costume Chair (Kim Wellschlager): Bins, bins, bins...Keep sending them in. Gather up those required undergarments but keep them at home for now, unless otherwise instructed.

- <u>Daughters:</u> The daughters Act 1 costume requires brown boots/shoes. We generally ask for cast members to provide their own footwear for best fit and comfort for dancing and performing. If your child has brown boots (tall like a riding boot or shorter lace up like a hiking boot) at home, please consider sending them in for us to take a look at and have them wear for the show. If you'd be interested in buying a pair, Walmart has racks of boots on clearance for \$5 and \$9.
 Example pictures included below. Act 2 footwear is a nude jazz shoe or ballet shoes (costume change is to bedtime attire). We do have a few in our inventory, so feel free to check with me before you buy some if you don't already have them.
- <u>Police</u>: Costume fittings and will happen this Thursday so please remind your child to have appropriate undergarments for trying on costumes as well as their bins to store their hats, gloves and any other accessories for their costumes. Black shoes with black soles for footwear.
- <u>Pirates:</u> We'll be continuing to assign costumes this week. Footwear is a pair of black boots if
 you have them or black shoes with black soles. We will use boot covers over black
 shoes/sneakers.
